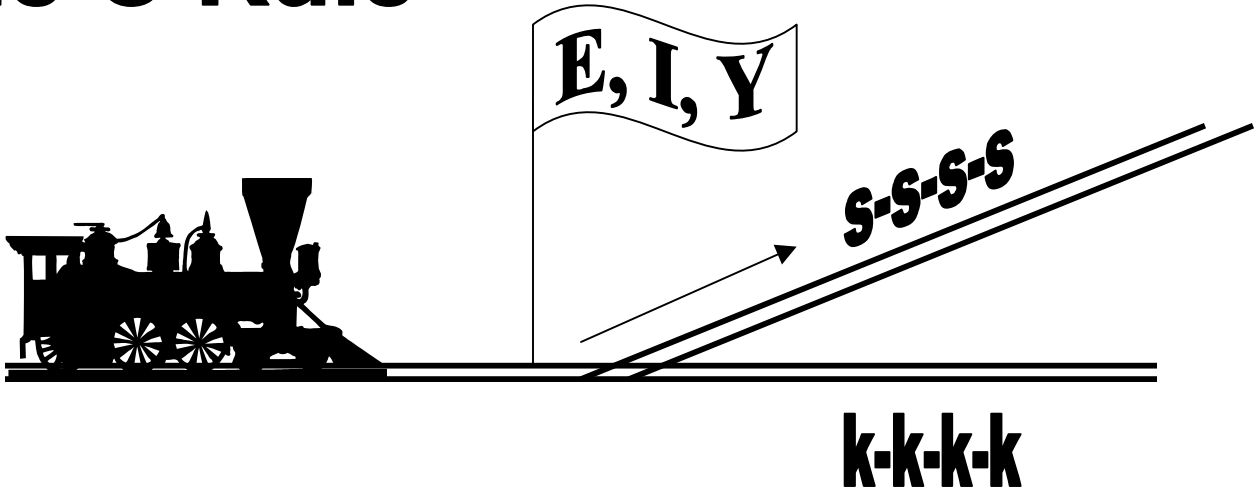


# The C Rule



If a C bumps into an E, I, or Y, it says, “s.” If it bumps into anything else, it says, “k.” (Ex: cent, city, cat, cup)

When spelling, if you can use a C, it is usually best to use it.

As with any rule, there are exceptions. This is the general rule, however.
